Our SMBA staff has been busy updating the website and planning for a new season of adventures on the trail! We are excited to announce the addition some new programs for 2021! New for this year is our full season Epic Team program. The Epic Team will be a cohort of 8 SMBA athletes who ride together all season (March-August), and focus on team camaraderie, adventures, long epic rides, and exploration of new trail routes throughout the summer. For 2021, we are expanding our 1 day/week Dirt Riders program into the summer for younger elementary

Athletes and coaches continue to capitalize on the amazing training access and volume provided by laps on Chute and LaBelle. Both morning Core Program groups and afternoon YSL athletes are working through various lane assignments within our exclusive arena. With the recent wind events and weather curve balls we've seen this season; having access to the Poma lift has been highly productive for everyone.

Our Freestyle and Big Mountain program is already laying down the progression for success this season, with events kicking off next week at Steamboat. The outstanding talents of our staff, Lex, Vitek, Kyle and the team are among the best in in Colorado, and we are excited to see this group continue to excel throughout the season.

Parent participating and travel to weekday races is certainly going to present challenges this season for everyone. With the USSA COVID Commission protocols, spectating at the base area, and finish corrals is going to be strongly discouraged. Already this season, we are seeing modifications to eliminate elements such as the finish area scoreboard. where athletes and parents congregate, to base lodge access (eliminated), to start arena designations by team. This is all in the effort to keep athletes, staff and programs safe and moving forward this season.

Multiple races in one day further will build the "mountain kids" toughness from character developed through 4 race runs, tough weather, cold feet & hands, and soggy neck buffs. Keep those backpacks packed with extra layers, gloves, neck buffs, goggles and plenty of snacks for the afternoon! Coaches are keeping the groups moving at the events, and maximizing the opportunity to freeski laps (keep

either. Our talented coaches, the backbone of this organization, have shown up with positive attitudes and the willingness to put in the work for these young athletes. It has been astonishing to see!

Our all-mountain side of this organization is now overseeing 4 different programs and we have athletes on the hill Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday. This is unprecedented in many sports clubs especially in a year like this! We have our Freeride/Freestyle program for both ski and snowboard, our All-Mountain Program for both ski and snowboard, we have our Snowboard Carve program, and we just launched our 5-Day Mini-Skills based camp that sold out in just days!

Our Freeride/Freestyle program is boasting 12 strong riders who are all committed to competition and have podium in their sight. These young riders have not only shown great progression in their own ability, but they have come out and impressed us with their ability to coach the younger riders. We encourage our team and all ages to build comradery, sportsmanship, and see the progression from both sides, as an athlete and as a coach. The benefits are countless.

Our Devo-All Mountain program has grown immensely this season even with our capped numbers and we are so excited to see so many passionate kids that want to push their skills to the next level. These young riders have shown us the raw passion they have to overcome any of the challenges they face. All of the Devo athletes that joined on our additional training day got to hang with the Freeride/Freestyle team and learn from their peers. We truly had a great time seeing the communication and encouragement amongst the entire crew of athletes. We are genuinely proud of them all!

We recently launched our 5-Day Mini Skills based camp. We have another 28 kids to strengthen,

school aged athletes who are newer to mountain biking. In July and August, we are offering a High School Skills Mini-Camp to help athletes prepare for the upcoming High School League race season. This year we will also see the return of our traditional 8-week after-school programs, summer team programs, and summer camps.

Registration for all SMBA programs opens on **January 18**th.

We are looking forward to a fantastic 2021 full of adventures and fun on the trails!

Over the years, she has had many snowsports jobs, from naming skis and ski boots for Nordica to selling high-end ski equipment to ski shops all over the world at trade shows to testing skis for Skiing magazine.

Starrett grew up in Hanover, New Hampshire, ski racing at Burke Mountain Academy, Ford Sayre and with Holderness on East Coast hardpack at Waterville Valley, New Hampshire. Starrett was a top-ten nationally ranked ski racer from
